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#### **APPENDIX A**

#### **ELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR**

The procedure adopted for the election of both Chair is set out below:

- i) A nomination paper will be issued to each member present on whom you are asked to nominate the person you would like to see as Chair for the ensuing year.
- ii) If there is only one name that person is elected.
- ii) If there is more than one each will be asked if they wish to stand. First the Chair will be asked, then the Vice Chair and then in alphabetical order.
- iii) If there is two or more an election shall take place.
- iv) If there are three or more candidates (v) will apply.
- v) The votes will be counted and if a candidate receives more than 50% of the vote there is only one round. If the person with the highest votes have not reached 50% then the person with the lowest votes drop off and vote is taken with the remaining candidates.
- vi) When there are only two candidates left it is a simple majority.
- vii) The voting shall be by secret ballot.

At the annual meeting the Chair shall wear the Town Chain of Office. It the current Chair stands down him/her will present the incoming Chair with the Chain of Office.

The chair when elected will be asked to complete the acceptance of office.

The election of a vice chair shall be completed as per items (i) to (vii) above.

Appendix A - Annual financial statement



#### 1. Llanfair Caereinion Town Council

Llanfair Caereinion Town Council was formed in 1974 under the Local Government Act 1972. It covers an area including Heniarth, part of Cyfronydd, Rhiwhiriaeth, Melin Y Ddol, part of Llanerfyl and the town itself.

Llanfair Caereinion Town Council is a medium sized community (town) council. It provides grass roots services to all parts of its community. The council's strategic direction is set by elected councillors (members) who oversee the town clerk who is responsible for delivering services on a day-to-day basis.

Notices of meetings, agendas, reports and minutes can also be viewed here, along with many governance documents and other information about the council.

The council's income included £46,000 from its precept, from which it derives almost all its funds.

The town council is responsible for a number of local services including Mount Field (as Trustee), Deri Woods (as Trustee) & Goat Field, public toilets, playground, tennis court, bowling green, youth club service, chapel of rest, Erw Ddwr, St Mary's churchyard, council office, signs and street furniture along with other minor responsibilities which contribute to the well-being of Llanfair Caereinion and its communities. The council is also looking to take a more active role in street cleaning during the year ending 31st March 2025.

The council's prime responsibility is to represent the community including being a statutory consultee regarding planning matters.

The full council meets on the last Monday of each month (except August).

The council is working towards being a competent council. This involves 67% of councillors being elected, unqualified accounts and a qualified town clerk.

The council has a number of policy document's including a Tonw Plan. During the year working with Powys County Council funding has been gained for Places Plan to be prepared in the forthcoming year.

The council also has a compliant website with a tourism website alongside.

#### 2. Information about Llanfair Caereinion

Llanfair Caereinion Town Council serves a population of around 2,000 within the Banwy Valley, in the eastern part of Montgomeryshire.

Today, Llanfair Caereinion is essentially rural, with a small town in the centre of its ward on the River Banwy.

There is a large church with churchyard in the centre of the town along with two chapels.

A variety of shops in the town include Londis, Spar, local butcher, veterinary practice, Wynnstay, newsagent, post office, fish & chip shop, barber, hairdressers, and café at the railway station. There are also three thriving public houses serving food daily. There is one petrol filling station with garage repair facilities. The town is blessed to have its own fire station, dentist (NHS) and medical centre. A further fast food outlet is due to open very soon in the centre of the town.

There are other local businesses including an array of caravan parks and bed & breakfast establishments.

The main tourist attraction is the Welshpool & Llanfair Light Railway who has over two hundred regular volunteers who support the town. The railway attracts over 25,000 visitors a year, some of which go into the town centre or to Deri Woods.

There is a town trail, Deri Woods walk by the river, a new playground and recreation ground as well as many footpaths for walking.

#### 3. Councillors and town clerk

The council has just one ward with twelve councillors. There were no vacancies at the end of the year.

Councillors are not paid and no allowances were paid in the year to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024.
